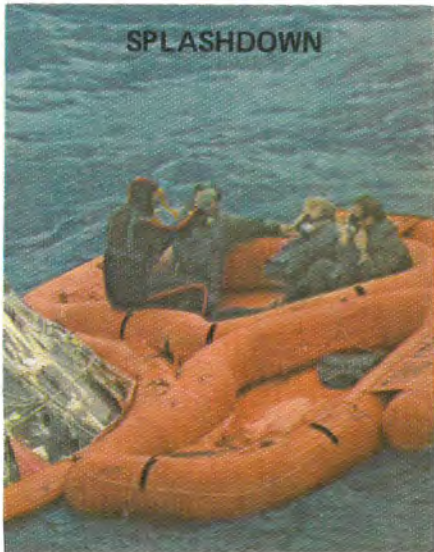

SPLASHDOWN OF APOLLO 15—CAPE CANAVERAL

At 4:46 P.M. today Apollo 15's Astronauts splashed down safely in the Pacific north of the Hawaiian Island of Oahu ending a 12 day journey to the moon acclaimed by scientists as "unprecedentedly successful." Apollo 15 hit the ocean at 21.8 miles per hour instead of the planned 19 mph, because of the faulty deployment of the 84 foot chute. Nevertheless, the Endeavour landed 6.32 miles off target, after slamming into the atmosphere at 4:32 P.M. at 24,545 miles per hour. By 5:27 the 3 Astronauts were on the recovery ship Okinawa. Mission completed.
